For more information, please contact us at 719.392.3475 / 231 Security Blvd / <u>info@securitywsd.com</u> During the January, 2021 public board meeting, the Board of Directors of the Security Water and Security Sanitation Districts/Enterprises passed a resolution to increase water and sewer rates in order to provide for overall existing and future operational and capital costs.

These new rates will increase the average residential winter-time water bill by about \$1.19 per month.

SEWER RATES - beginning with the April 1, 2021 billing

This new rate will increase the average residential sewer bill by about \$1.53 per month.

Fees described herein may be revised as determined in the reasonable discretion of the Boards of Directors of the Security Water and Sanitation Districts and as permitted by law.



WINTER WATERING TIPS

- Choose a warm day with air temperature above 40 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Ensure that the soil is not frozen.
- Water for short periods, allowing water to soak in before re-applying.
- Water at mid-day so that water can soak in before it freezes at night.
- Newly planted lawns, trees, shrubs and flowers require the most attention in winter gardening along with established turf and trees located in sunny, windy or exposed areas.
- **REMEMBER:** Remove the hose from the spigot after watering. Leaving the hose attached can cause water to freeze in your pipes, resulting in expensive damage.
